

# St Cuthbert's House

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## **Driving to St Cuthbert's House from the north.**

Come south on the main A1 trunk road. Your turning off the A1 is approximately 13 miles south of the prominent town of Berwick upon Tweed (which has a bypass.)

Watch for a LEFT turn, signposted for Budle and Waren Mill, which also has a brown 'tourist' sign marking the Northumberland Coastal Route. (It comes shortly after signs for Belford, to the right)

Cross the main East Coast railway line, and in a few hundred metres, at the T junction, turn RIGHT.

Stay on this road around all of its twists and turns. After 4 miles it brings you to the village of Bamburgh, and you pass beneath the walls of its imposing castle... again you stay on the same road, which now brings you along the coast. Watch out for the beautiful seascapes, and views of the Farne Islands just offshore!

As you pass the sign which says 'Welcome to Seahouses' and the 30mph speed restriction sign, turn RIGHT. There is a brown 'tourist' sign marked 'North Sunderland local services'.

Follow this lane to its end at a T junction in less than a mile, where you turn RIGHT. (A brown sign marked 'St Cuthbert's House' points the way.)

St Cuthbert's House is the prominent 'church' building, about 50 metres on the right. Turn in to the car park immediately before the house, and park nose-in to the fence!

The whole adventure from the A1 is about 8 miles.
